

PURPOSE

The New Almaden Quicksilver County Park Association (NAQCPA) held its first board meeting on February 22, 1983 and established goals for itself. Here are the goals:

- 1. To increase public awareness, understanding, and enjoyment of the historical, recreational, biological and geological resources of Almaden Quicksilver County Park
- 2. To encourage and facilitate community involvement in
 - A. The development, maintenance, and protection of recreation facilities within the park
 - B. The commemoration, restoration, interpretation and protection of historical resources within the park
 - C. The interpretation, management, and protection of natural resources within the park
 - D. The establishment and operation of interpretive programs and facilities within the park.

The initial **Board of Directors** was elected in April 1983. It includes <u>Kitty Monahan</u>, Dick Forst, Nancy Mason, Bob Clement, Scott Denham, Fred Celsi, <u>Mike Cox</u>, Kay Carmody, Steve Lorenz, and Peggy Melbourne. (Kitty and Mike Cox remain on the board. [4/1983]

NAQCPA incorporated as a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit [8/1984]

NAQCPA has 500 members [Fall 1994]

NAQCPA signed memorandum of understanding with parks [Aug 1997]
